In 2023, most people were interested to know the meaning of our name and what it signified. As described above, our name mainly highlights our areas of focus and intervention in our communities. We are proud to be JAMNEL.

In 2023, Jamnel Care Organization Celebrated 4 years since our founding in an insignificant locality in Juba, where a group of girls came together with common interests to ensure they lessen inequalities that hinder women and girls from thriving. In the 4 years, our generous supporters helped us raise more than \$64,000 enough to bring women rights' service and economic empowerment interventions to more than 5,000 people.

During the year, for the first time since 2020, we were able to regularly gather as an organization, with local communities, partners, and supporters. Each meeting recapped us that our work is people-powered and our motto value communities is at the core of our interventions guaranteeing commitment to collaborative work with communities, valuing their needs and strengths.

In 2023, Our community's commitment to eradicate harmful social norms and promote livelihoods gave us reasons to celebrate. The adolescent girls we sponsored in schools gave us even more reasons to be proud as they exceptionally performed well in their examinations. The gbv ambassadors in Schools showed greater understanding of gbv concepts both in school and in the community and this was expressed in their attitudes and vigor to advocate including on media shows.





We love supporters

- In 2023, We were pleased to sign a new contract with Amplify Change.
- We have also received grants form Global fund for Women supporting our Activities.

Organization Growth

- Flexible grants enabled us develop a 5 year strategic plan and establish our financial systems.
- Staff capacity building exercises on project cycle management, financial management, Monitoring and Evaluation was also done this year hence increasing our capacity to be ready to implement projects effectively.

More Advocacy

- Adolescent girls and boys were engaged in debate sessions in different schools covering GBV topics of discussions. The schools gave a greater platform for advocacy with an intention of replication int the communities.
- Media talk shows conducted with beneficiaries at the forefront of advocacy creating a conducive environment for mass advocacy, gaining a wider audience.
- Positive masculinity training was done with boys in school to ensure positive shift of attitudes and behavior to ensure protection of women and girls.

Empowerment

Girls were trained on leadership, communication self-awareness and decision-making skills to make them resilient and navigate through life's complexities.

Hygiene Promotion

This year, the organization bought and distributed 344 dignity kits to 344girls in schools. This was accompanied by training on menstrual hygiene practices and demonstration on the use of the products.


