Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR)

Jamnel Care Organization conducted a baseline study with 100 respondents across Munuki, Rejaf, and Lirya Payams. The study identified SRHR policy gaps, which informed advocacy strategies and influenced local policy discussions.

The organization produced a documentary on SRHR, reaching 600 viewers and raising awareness through real-life stories.

Additionally, JCO organized 6 workshops and campaigns, equipping 400 women and girls with practical SRHR knowledge and advocacy skills.

JCO established partnerships with local media to facilitate 4 talk shows, boosting public discussions and increasing SRHR visibility to an estimated audience of 4,000.

The organization also published 12 articles in local newspapers to educate the public and advocate for policy change.

Furthermore, JCO trained 213 women and girls as paralegals, equipping them with knowledge of SRHR laws and advocacy skills.

The organization secured 6 safe spaces in Juba, in collaboration with partners, to provide SRHR services, support, and empowerment programs.

Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Prevention and Response

Jamnel Care Organization conducted focus group discussions with community decision-makers, challenging harmful beliefs and promoting gender equality.

The organization trained school boys in positive masculinity, reaching 30 participants and fostering healthy relationships and respect for women and girls.

Additionally, JCO organized a community discussion on the EMAP framework, engaging 100 individuals to prevent GBV through collective action and advocacy.

A public education campaign raised awareness about GBV, mobilizing over 100 community members to take action against violence.

Women and Girls' Empowerment

JCO provided life skills training to 60 vulnerable adolescent girls, enhancing their personal resilience and informed decision-making.

The organization conducted leadership training for 30 girls and women, equipping them with skills in decision-making, public speaking, and community leadership.

Furthermore, JCO offered vocational training in hairdressing and soap-making to 10 women and girls, alongside leadership development, financial literacy, and entrepreneurship skills, empowering them to achieve economic independence and lead within their communities.

Key Dates of 2024

March 28-29, 2024

The first series of paralegal training sessions in Juba. This was a key initiative to build awareness and skills on sexual and reproductive health rights in the community.

April 2, 2024

Training session in Rajaf Payam, focusing on menstruation, menstrual hygiene, and empowerment strategies for adolescent girls.

April 6, 2024

Awareness session held in Rajaf Payam, focusing on HIV/AIDS prevention, transmission, prevention strategies, and addressing stigma.

- Train local communities in leadership, project management, and skills development, while strengthening community-based organizations to ensure lasting impact.
- Collaborate with local governments, NGOs, and community groups to transfer knowledge, skills, and responsibilities for sustainable programs.
- Engage community members in planning, decision-making, and implementation to foster ownership and create sustainable, community-led initiatives and livelihood programs for economic empowerment.
- Invest in essential infrastructure such as schools, health facilities, and water systems, ensuring local authorities can maintain and manage these resources independently.
- Provide education and training to enhance community self-sufficiency.
- Establish robust monitoring and evaluation systems to assess long-term impact and integrate community feedback for continuous improvement.
- Develop a clear exit strategy based on achieving development milestones and ensuring local capacity to sustain efforts.
- Incorporate environmentally sustainable practices into projects by using ecofriendly technologies and approaches.
- Advocate for policies supporting sustainable development and addressing vulnerabilities, engaging authorities to embed humanitarian principles into longterm planning.
- Share expertise with local communities, document lessons learned, and compile success stories to guide future initiatives.

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
